



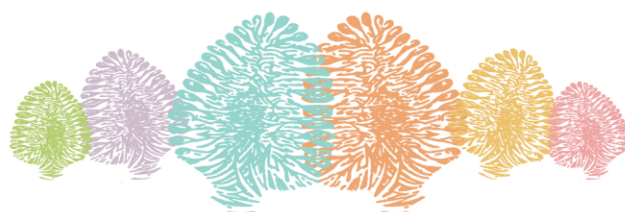
Sunny Goddard BHSc AdvDHom

Sunny is also a member of the urinary tract infection Research Pod, and co-author with Celeste Salter of *Research Pods: building community resilience and research together: A team approach designed to enhance community resilience and research output for practitioners of homoeopathy in Australia*, published in Similia, December 2022.

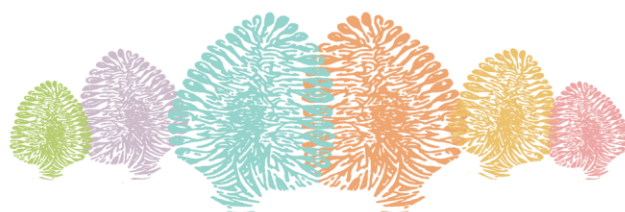
Sunny is a professional member of the AHA, registered with ARoH and in professional practice in Bega, NSW, Australia.

Celeste is the Research Coordinator for The Aurum Project and Research Pod concept originator together with Sunny Goddard. Pod research explores novel ways of conducting practitioner-based research in alignment with the practices and approach taken by homeopaths in practice. Since joining The Aurum Project, Celeste has led the First National Survey of Homeopaths in Australia in 2019, and co-created six research activities within The Aurum Project, including the international collaboration with Dr Sujata Naik's Homeopathy Clinic in Mumbai, researching homeopathy and molluscum contagiosum. Other research topics include Urinary Tract Infection, a workforce survey of Australian homeopaths, respiratory diseases and a systematic review on homeopathy literature published in and by Australians since 1990. Celeste is registered with ARoH and in professional practice in Katoomba, NSW, Australia.
