Linlee Jordan is the director of The Aurum Project for homoeopathy research and the Harbord Homeopathic Clinic in Brookvale, Sydney. Linlee has been involved in the Australian Homeopathy Research Priorities working group since 2008. The group more recently decided that an Australian review of the literature on homoeopathy was a top priority. A research pod was formed on the topic and has resulted in an extensive search of the literature. Publications about the same will show the breadth and depth of the literature on homoeopathy in our country.

In her clinical work, Linlee has worked for 33 years with families on the northern beaches of Sydney. Her special interests are in paediatrics, including development delay, child behaviour and skin conditions such as molluscum contagiosum. Linlee is author of *Challenging Children: Success with Homeopathy* and she is a chapter author in the book *Homeopathy & Autism Spectrum Disorder: a guide for practitioners and families*.

Other research topics include Urinary Tract Infection, a workforce survey of Australian homoeopaths, respiratory diseases and a systematic review on homoeopathy literature published in and by Australians since 1990.
