Jane trained in the UK at the Welsh School of Homeopathy, attended post studies in Calcutta and regularly returns to Europe for further seminars and clinical experience at the Hahnemann Institute in The Hague. Jane is a registered member in Australia of both ARoH (Australian Register of Homoeopaths) and the Australian Homoeopathic Association (AHA) as well as of the Society of Homeopaths (SOH) UK. Jane is also Vice President of The Aurum Project, Australia's peak body for homoeopathic research.

In the UK, Jane set up a local branch of FOCC (Friends of Chernobyl's Children), bringing groups of children, post Chernobyl, out of Belarus to the UK for a 5-year health improvement programme from ages 7 to 12 years. This gave valuable and early insight into the significant improvement and dramatic changes in health and well-being which homoeopathy can bring, even or especially in difficult social, environmental and cultural situations.

In the UK Jane also set-up a pilot project to assess the impact of vaccination on childhood illnesses and offered low-cost treatment to address developmental issues, skin complaints, allergies and other common childhood complaints which may occur around the time of vaccination.

In 2010 Jane was invited to help with the SSEC (South Seas Evangelical Church) 'Water Medicine', first introduced to homoeopathy by Christian missionaries nearly a century ago. Today over 150 village pastors dispense from their kits of 52 remedies, treating a wide variety of acute and chronic illnesses.
